Nu was born into a poor rural family of six children in Duy Nghia commune, in Duy Xuyen district of Quang Nam. She has been severely disabled in both legs since birth, unable grow to a normal height. Movement and activities are challenging for her and she always needs help. She knew early on that her physical disability would make heavy work more difficult and that she would be unable to help her parents in farming. So she resolved to put all her energy into studying for university entrance, to use her brain instead of her body.

Her lecturers find her a petite and incredibly hardworking, dynamic student. Nu is fairly quiet but is always attentive and inquisitive, always striving to overcome her disability. When DTU learned about Nu's circumstances, they decided to offer her free tuition to reduce her problems and allow her to study without further worries.
