During lectures by Dr. Young Wook Ko of Queen's University in Belfast, Dr. Maged Elkashian and Dr. Duong Quang Trung of Queen Mary's University in London, Dr. Le Ngoc Phuc of Wollongong University in Australia and Dr. Ha Dac Binh of Duy Tan University, participants were introduced to much new advanced research information, including tips on how to produce effective references and citations, how to avoid plagiarizing, the range of scientific writing styles, presentation techniques, ISI paper formats, the use of software in research and computational applications and research methods in Electrical Engineering, IT, and other fields.

Dr. Trung said: "This first International Summer School at DTU is for those who have been awarded their PhDs abroad to share their expertise in research, with the objective of teaching participants about the latest research methodologies and how to avoid disappointment when applying for foreign PhD programs."
