The Nursing lab equipment donated by the Glome Management Group included one homecare room and one hospital room, with beds with Antidecubitus mattresses, a cabinet, a trolley, a Cole Mat C hyper (MSN1200) HCH-1, a bed table, Infusion pole MY-22258 and a Home-Diagnosis medical bag with consumables.

Glome and DTU then signed another agreement to provide extra Nursing training and for lecturers to come to DTU to implement a Japanese language program. In addition, Glome will grant 30 scholarships for the first students enrolling in the training program.
